DRAMATURG'S NOTE

The Con Man Behind the Curtain:

Welcome to this high-flying musical comedy about chasing your dreams, not getting caught, and most importantly, holding yourself accountable. Though our protagonist here is quite carefree, the real-life Frank Abagnale, born in 1948, has faced criticisms alongside his fame. Although many of the stories shared in the show and his autobiography have been debunked, Abagnale continues to profit from his past. Abagnale asked the critics, "Is 50 years not long enough to receive some redemption for a crime committed when one was a teenager?" (Dillon, Nancy). Forgiveness is a virtue, and Abagnale's continued reliance on an embellished narrative is just a different version of the same con. Andrew K. Bentley, Pan Am's director of security wrote to critics "I am sorry not to have the time or the inclination to rebut the same dribble this individual has been peddling for years," (May 18, 1982). The time Abaanale wasn't incarcerated amounts to 14 months. In order to cash 17,000 checks, as he claims, it would mean 40 checks daily. In contradiction to claims of only targeting large corporations, Abagnale was accused of stealing from ordinary people, including \$1,200 from a family who took him in.

Catch Me if You Can, set in the 1960s, features a Frank who views his life through the lens of a variety show. Originating from vaudeville, variety shows showcased comedy, music, and sketches, pushing social satire and rapid humor. The variety show format declined in the 1970s with the rise of cable TV, though its elements live on in late-night and talent-based shows. Well-known variety shows of the time included The Ed Sullivan Show, The Smothers Brothers Comedy Hour, and The Carol Burnett Show.

The music heard in the musical can best be attributed to The Swing Era, led by figures like Duke Ellington and Benny Goodman, which peaked in the mid-1930s but declined by the late 1940s due to the AFM recording ban and the rise of bebop. The influences of the Crooner Era, spanning the 1920s to 1950s, can also be heard throughout the musical. The era featured intimate vocalists like Frank Sinatra, on whom a lot of Frank Abagnale's characterization is based, Bing Crosby, and Dean Martin, with Rudy Vallée as the father of crooning. This style faded in the 1960s as rock 'n' roll took over. The 1960s music scene reflected social and political shifts, with rock 'n' roll, surf music, the British Invasion, and Motown records shaping its sound. Key artists included The Beatles, The Rolling Stones, The Beach Boys, Bob Dylan, and Motown legends like The Supremes and Marvin Gaye. Want to learn more? Check out the lobby display! ASSISTANT DIRECTORS' NOTE

Sometimes when we're young we don't realize that there are consequences to our actions. The main character in Catch Me If You Can named Frank Jr. endures unpredictable challenges that force him to constantly keep running away from his true self. As his character changes who he is, he is perceived to be clever and witty. No one has ever accomplished what he has done before. But how will running away hinder his future?

In his eyes, do rewards outweigh the cost of living a full life? Frank Jr. is determined to keep living within his lies until he realizes there is so much more to life than running away; there's love. He was taught that deception was the only way to survive. However, everyone has to face their problems and take responsibility. Will Frank Jr. be able to keep running or will love get in the way? Nonetheless, this musical proves to us that everyone is redeemable.

Catch Me If You Can challenges us to look within and discover that life is too short to waste time running. We need to embrace life and live it to the fullest. This musical tells the tale of a charming, mastermind dreamer who utilizes his abilities to escape reality and orchestrate his fantasy through a 60s variety show lens. Through his perspective on life, we learn that not everything is better in black and white. Buckle up, hang on tight, and enjoy the ride!
