Academic Regalia

The gowns and hoods worn on solemn academic occasions perpetuate traditions as old as the world's oldest universities. While European institutions display great diversity in the design and color of academic regalia, their American counterparts adopted a code of regulations that makes it possible for the academic community to identify from the cut of the gown and the color of the hood the wearer's degree, the subject in which it was conferred, and the institution that granted it. In recent years many colleges and universities have departed from the traditional black and adopted official colors for their academic gowns. Thus, the blue gowns with gold chevrons worn by the president and trustees of Ithaca College display the official colors of this institution.

The cut of the gown identifies the degree. The bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves and is worn closed. The master's

gown has oblong-cut sleeves slit at the elbow and is worn open or closed. The length of the hood also identifies the degree: 36 inches for a bachelor's degree and 42 inches for a master's degree. The color of the hood's velvet binding identifies the wearer's specialized field of study. These colors include white for arts and letters, light brown for business, light blue for education, purple for law, lemon for library science, pink for music, sage green for physical education, blue for philosophy, gold for science, and red for theology.

The silk lining of the hood displays the color or colors of the institution awarding the degree. Earned and honorary degrees awarded by Ithaca College are shown by hoods lined in royal blue and crossed with gold chevrons.

Honor Cords and Stoles

HONOR CORDS

Commencement includes many traditions that have been passed down through generations. Among these traditions is the honor cord. The colors of the cords signify graduation honors based on high academic achievement. These honors, listed below, are associated with Latin phrases that indicate the level of distinction with which an academic degree is earned. Ithaca College confers three levels of Latin honors to undergraduates earning a bachelor's degree. The cumulative grade point average ranges for these honors are listed below. A minimum of 60 credits of coursework must be completed at Ithaca College to qualify for this recognition. The honors listed for the students in this program are based on their cumulative grade point average as calculated at the beginning of the fall term. Honors that appear on students' actual diplomas will be based on their final cumulative grade point average.

Magna cum Laude 3.700–3.899

FIRST-GENERATION HONOR CORDS

Here at Ithaca College, we value our first-generation student population. We define a first-generation student as one who is the first in their family to attend and graduate from a four-year residential college in the United States. These students at IC have gone the extra mile as leaders throughout campus and have accomplished remarkable things in and out of the classroom. To celebrate this achievement, they received a black and gold honor cord for today's ceremony. We wish all of our first-generation graduates well as they embark on their professional aspirations.

RAINBOW HONOR CORDS

Multicolored rainbow honor cords are worn by some of the LGBTQ and allied graduates at today's ceremony and by LGBTQ and allied students at colleges and universities throughout the world at commencement. Since 2003, IC students have received their cords and been celebrated at the annual Rainbow Reception, now called Lavender Graduation, which highlights their achievements. The history of LGBTQ inclusion at Ithaca College would be impossible without the fearless and tireless efforts of its allies and supporters. The use of rainbow colors as a sign of diversity and inclusiveness is a long-standing tradition. The rainbow or pride flag was created by San Francisco artist Gilbert Baker in 1978. The colors symbolize diversity throughout LGBTQ communities and have individual significance: life (red), healing (orange), sunlight (yellow), nature (green), art/ harmony (blue), and spirit (purple).

KENTE STOLES

The Kente stole is a patterned, rich, and handwoven cloth that originates with Akan weavers in present-day Ghana. For royalty throughout West Africa, Kente is a sacred cloth worn only in times of extreme importance. Similarly, it has been an Ithaca College tradition to present Kente stoles in recognition of select students who exemplify leadership in programs with the BIPOC Unity Center or other campus programs. The symbol on the Kente stoles, Nea Onnim No Sua A, Ohu, is a West African Adinkra symbol for "knowledge" and "a lifelong quest for learning."

VETERAN STOLES

Another Commencement tradition at Ithaca College is the presentation of stoles to graduating students who are veterans of the United States Armed Forces. The stoles, which display each student's branch of service, are offered to graduating veterans in recognition of and gratitude for their service in protecting our country and as a symbol of their self-sacrifice and service.
